Q1) What is the largest challenge corporate sustainability models have faced in adapting farm to fork into their models?

Leading food companies take a farm to fork approach to sustainability, but a key challenge is focusing on material impacts that the company can feasibly address in setting up the organization for success.

Q2) What major changes have been made to supply chain models to incorporate farm to fork initiatives?

There is an increased awareness of shared needs/opportunities to drive action. As a result, there is greater trust and collaboration, which encourages more communication, transparency, and shared value.

Q3) What, in your opinion, has been one of the most successful changes made to the supply chain to adapt farm to fork models?

Approaching opportunities one step at a time without losing sight of the bigger picture and broader system, partners, and value.

Q4) How could that model/change be more widely used in corporate sustainability?
